- Reference services and consultations in the search for printed materials and e-resources;
- Interlibrary loan services from Latvian libraries;
- Scanning text and images.





Paid services

- Printing, copying;
- Scanning (if done by the librarian);
- Compilation of a bibliographic list of information resources according to the thematic request;

Open Access Loan

5 steps to receive books

- Register with a librarian at the beginning of the academic year;
- Choose the necessary books from the shelf;
- At the self-service device, scan the student ID card, connect to your user account;
- Register the picked books;
- When finished, log out of your user account.





IMPORTANT TO KNOW: insight into the Library Terms of Use



Most importantly, whole document here

- When visiting any service point of the Library, the Student Card must be presented;
- All sources of information available in the Library must be protected, they must not be damaged by making notes, tearing pages, etc. Upon receipt of a defective source of information, the librarian must be notified immediately of the observed defects;
- The terms of use of information sources received for use outside the Library must be observed;
- If the deadline for the use of information sources is not observed, a penalty payment must be paid;
- If the debt for the previous study year has not been settled, from 1st September, the right to receive information sources for use outside the Library premises is lost;
- A lost source of information should be placed with the same or an equivalent source of information in coordination with the librarian. If this is not possible, the value of the lost information resource must be reimbursed according to the current market value;
- The Library must be informed about changes in contact information surname, telephone number, etc.





The period of returning a book issued for one month in the Open Access subscription on Dzirciema Street and in the MITC branch on Anninmuižas Boulevard can be extended once from your user account in the Electronic Catalog Primo or in the self-service device.

Extension is possible only if the specific copy has not been requested by another user!

You can also order/reserve Primo books from your user account.

The reserved book must be taken within 3 working days.





Follow changes in working hours !!!

Reasons for changes in the opening hours of the Library and its branches:

- On the last Friday of February, the Library is closed to users from 08.30 to 14.00, the last Friday in August and the third Friday in December -Cleaning Day, the library is closed to users;
